In relation to the 125 posts to be created to perform food safety regulatory functions and provide pest control services, Dr Hon KWOK Ka-ki requested the Administration to confirm the number of new posts (with a breakdown by type of posts) to be created for the food surveillance work undertaken in the Mainland.

<u>Reply</u>:

Of the net 125 posts provided under Programme (1) in 2007-08, 36 posts are to be created for strengthening import control of food from the Mainland and other exporting countries including enhancing farm inspections. These include 28 Health Inspector grade officers as well as 2 Veterinary Officers and 6 Field Officers. The resources to undertake food surveillance work in the Mainland is not separately identifiable.

<u>Reply</u>:

In 2006, the Food and Environmental Hygiene Department carried out 806 investigations at licensed food premises suspected to be involved in food poisoning outbreaks. Of them, the number of investigations to Type I (low risk), Type II (medium risk) and Type III (high risk) licensed food premises under the Risk-based Inspection System are 143, 235 and 428 respectively.

Question:

As an international metropolis in Asia, Hong Kong attracts a lot of tourists. Our rural areas are very popular with the tourists too. But many remaining aqua privies in the New Territories and outlying islands are in poor sanitary and environmental condition. Has the Government any plan for their improvement works? What is the projected cost?

Asked by: Hon. LAM Wai-keung, Daniel

Reply:

Since early 2005, the Food and Environmental Hygiene Department (FEHD) has converted 60 aqua privies (APs) under its conversion programme to upgrade APs in the New Territories and outlying islands into flushing toilets. Another 37 APs under this programme will be converted by end 2007. The estimated cost for converting all these APs is \$92.8 million.

Subject to funding approval, FEHD will convert another 50 APs in 2008 – 09, at an estimated cost of \$108 million.
